Science at TLT

As Trust Director of Science, you will oversee the Science curriculum across our Trust secondary schools (currently Honley High School, The Brooksbank School and Ryburn Valley High School). Brooksbank and Ryburn are 11-18 schools with internal post-16 provision including A level Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Applied Science (BTEC) is also offered across the two schools as part of our aligned curriculum.

All schools follow the AQA Science specifications offering Triple Science within the option blocks at each school. All Trust schools use Seneca to support pupils' independent study.

The development of teaching and learning is always our key priority as a Trust, and for the schools as a whole. The Science Departments are progressive, constantly striving to meet the varied needs of comprehensive pupils. Alongside this they aim to achieve the rigorous demands of an ever-evolving curriculum. All schools have strong and dynamic teams who meet regularly to discuss the development of teaching and learning, to share ideas and to support each other.

The Trust encourages the enjoyment of Science through quality teaching on a day-to-day basis. Scientific investigation is a fundamental part of student development, and all the Science Departments strive to ensure that all pupils within the Trust leave with key skills as well as strong outcomes. Across the Trust STEM clubs are offered as part of the extra-curricular programme, and cross-Trust competition has been introduced to complement the collaborative working.

As Director of Science, you will work closely with our existing excellent leaders to secure outstanding outcomes for all students via a rich and rewarding curriculum for all. Student leadership is at the forefront of everything we do, and our staff work tirelessly to provide opportunities for students to ensure they have a voice. Key to student progression is ensuring all students can access a curriculum which is broad and balanced, as well as providing additional opportunities for extra curriculum events such as trips, visiting museums and workshops to provide links to real life examples.
