- Have a good understanding of the range of factors affecting children's mental health and support available.
- Have Mental Health First Aid training and Team Teach or be willing to undertake.
- Be a good listener who is patient, proactive and shows initiative.
- Be aspirational for and have a good understanding of the difficulties and challenges faced by children from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Devise, implement and evaluate specialised interventions and programmes that support individuals social and emotional wellbeing and mental health. Maintain records as evidence of support and guidance.
- Help children manage and resolve conflict.
- Have strong behaviour management skills and strategies to support children, emotionally and sometimes physically, who are dysregulated.
- Have excellent communication skills and be able to build strong and positive relationships with colleagues, children and families.
- Have high personal and professional standards to be able to work with external agencies.
- Be competent in the use of IT.
- Facilitate games and activities to support pupils in unstructured times including using the outdoors.
- Take responsibility and show a commitment to professional learning and development.
- Train and support LSA's in strategies to support pupils in class.
- Be able to work collaboratively with all members of the school community and support the wider ethos and activities of the school.
